Voter turnout for the 2022 Newmarket Municipal Election was **24.8 per cent** of eligible voters with a total of **15,221** ballots submitted. We will be gathering additional data from the 2022 Newmarket Municipal Election and posting them at newmarketvotes.ca once available.

Voters' Lists

In accordance with the Municipal Elections Act, the Clerk is required to provide the list of voters who voted during the advanced voting period. In the 2022 Newmarket Municipal Election, the advanced voting period was **October 15 to October 23**. The Act does not require the Clerk to provide candidates with a list of voters who voted on October 24.

Please note that the Voters' List contains personal information and, in accordance with the Act, candidates are reminded not to use the List for any purpose other than for campaign purposes, and that any copies of the List must be destroyed.

Important Note: Copies of the Voters' List will be removed from the Candidates' Portal by end of day on Friday, October 28, 2022.

Election Sign Removals

Please remember that election signs must be removed from public and private property no later than today, Thursday, October 27 at 8 PM.

Election sign deposit returns will be processed shortly. Candidates can expect to receive individual emails about their returns in the coming weeks.

Candidate Responsibilities after the Election - Financial Statements

Candidates whose campaigns have run a deficit can extend their campaign period beyond the end date of January 3, 2023 (the usual campaign end date of December 31 falls on a Saturday this year, so the date has been set at January 3, 2023). In order **extend their campaign**, a candidate must complete and submit the [Notice of Extension of Campaign Period - Form 6](#) to the Clerk no later than 4:30 PM on Monday, January 3, 2023.

In accordance with the Municipal Elections Act, all candidates, including those that were acclaimed, must complete and submit a [Financial Statement - Auditor's Report Candidate - Form 4](#) to the Clerk no later than 2:00 PM on Friday, March 31, 2023.

Spending Limits for Appreciation Parties

With campaigns wrapping up, some candidates may be holding parties or expressing their appreciation in other ways. As stated in the [2022 Candidates' Guide – Ontario municipal council and school board elections](#):

"The spending limit for expenses related to holding parties and other expressions of appreciation after the close of voting is calculated as 10% of the amount of your general spending limit. Expenses related to parties and expressions of appreciation are subject to the specific spending limit regardless of whether they are incurred before or after voting day."
